









Key findings from the survey:

Here's an alternative version of the provided text:

- 1. A majority of students have expressed overall satisfaction with the timely completion of the syllabus (59.6%) and effective communication between teachers and students (62.9%).
- 2. Students have praised the teacher's dedication to teaching and fairness in evaluation. However, they suggested focusing more on underperforming students to build their confidence and improve their academic outcomes.
- 3. The teacher's preparedness, communication skills, application of effective teaching methods, and fairness in internal evaluations received high ratings in the survey.
- 4. Students also acknowledged (strongly agreed: 25.8%, agreed: 53.9%) the implementation of student-centric approaches, such as experiential learning, participative learning, and problem-solving techniques, which enhance their overall learning experience.

Session: 2023-24

Students represent the cornerstone of the higher education system, serving as its primary stakeholders. Their active engagement and meaningful participation are indispensable in shaping both internal and external quality assurance mechanisms. As stipulated in the institutional policy on feedback systems, colleges are mandated to conduct annual online feedback to enhance academic standards.

For the academic year 2023–2024, comprehensive feedback was solicited from undergraduate and postgraduate students concerning the curriculum. This initiative sought constructive insights and recommendations regarding the prescribed syllabus formulated by the parent institution, Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University, Amravati.

Key Observations:

- o 63.4% of students agree that the syllabus aligns well with their chosen course.
- 24.1% strongly agree, suggesting high satisfaction from nearly one-fourth of students.
- A minority (10.5%) remain neutral, while only 2% expressed dissatisfaction.

• Implications:

The syllabus is largely meeting the expectations of the majority, but there is a small group that feels it could be better tailored to the course.

2. Has the syllabus a good balance between theory and application?

• Key Observations:

- o Over half (58.1%) agree, and 23.3% strongly agree that the syllabus balances theoretical and practical content effectively.
- o 15.7% are neutral, while 2.9% believe this balance needs improvement.

• Implications:

While the majority is satisfied, a closer examination of practical components could enhance the perceived balance for the neutral or dissatisfied respondents.

3. Does the syllabus provide scope for higher education/employment?

• Key Observations:

- o 58.1% agree, and 19.2% strongly agree that the syllabus provides sufficient scope for pursuing higher education or employment opportunities.
- 19.8% are neutral, and 2.9% feel the scope is inadequate.

This indicates a generally favorable outlook, but the syllabus could incorporate more employability or research-oriented content to address concerns.

5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by teachers:

- o 64.4% strongly agree, and 23% agree that the internal evaluation process is fair
- o Only a small fraction (8.4% neutral and 4.4% dissatisfied) expressed concerns.

• Implications:

The evaluation system is widely appreciated, suggesting well-implemented and transparent practices.

6. Does the institute conduct programs to develop employability skills?

• Key Observations:

- o A significant 81.1% strongly agree, and 6.1% agree that the institute emphasizes employability skills.
- o 12.8% are neutral, with no reported dissatisfaction.

• Implications:

The institute excels in this area. Expanding and promoting these programs further might engage the remaining neutral respondents.

7. Do teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projectors for teaching?

• Key Observations:

- o 37.5% are neutral, and 34.3% agree with the use of ICT tools, while 26.2% strongly agree.
- Minor dissatisfaction (0.9%) and strong dissatisfaction (0.6%) are reported.

Mixed feedback suggests that ICT adoption varies. Consistent use of technology and training for faculty might improve this aspect.


02 .Guest Lecture:-
